I. Welcome and Introductions

II. Local Champion Provider

Zoey Goore, MD, MPH (Kaiser Permanente, Roseville)

Dr. Goore has been Chief of Medical Education for the Sacramento Valley for the past six years, chair of the outpatient pediatric education committee for Northern CA Kaiser Permanente and is on the National Committee on Continuing Medical Education for the American Association of Pediatrics (AAP) as well as vice president for AAP Chapter 1. She is very involved in Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA), We Help Youth (WHY), and other foster care collaboratives, as well as helping pediatricians address resource scarcity, especially food scarcity, among their patients.

Dr. Goore is trained as a media spokesperson and is also willing to help identify other providers in the area who are able to support local health efforts. III. Program Spotlight Presentation

David Saunders, Andrew Manthe, and Jeannine Barbato provided an overview of the objectives and services offered by *Prevention First*:

"Prevention First is the name given to a CDC grant titled State Public Health Actions to Prevent and Control Diabetes, Heart Disease, Obesity and Associated Risk Factors, and Promote School Health.

The grant is administered by the California Department of Public Health. The California Department of Education is a subcontractor.

The overall objectives of the school health component of the grant are:

- Increase consumption of nutritious food and beverages
- Increase participation in Physical Activity
- Prevention of hypertension, diabetes, overweight and obesity

To accomplish our objectives *Prevention First* is developing a county based structure. This infrastructure will enable the State agencies access to key stakeholders in each county who have relationships and undertakings within our designated schools. We assist them in scale, growth and impact by providing professional development and technical assistance.

In Sacramento County we serve the Sacramento City and Twin Rivers Unified School Districts."

Highlights from brainstorm of skills needed to create a successful funding proposal:

- Read and understand the R.F.A
- Ability to follow directions and meet deadlines
- Understand the budget
- Need to be realistic and resourceful
- Knowledge of the collaborative partners skill set
- Understand the skills of staff and update these skills regularly (writing, graphics, time management, etc.)
- Writing skills (technical, concise, grammar, and editing)
- Write SMART objectives (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant, and Timebound)
- Research oriented
- Locate database
- Networking/collaboration
- Develop logic models
- Know history of the funder
- Evaluation plan

V. Gallery Walk to Review 2014 Activities and Plan for 2015
